Bad Behavior or Sex Addiction
(Men Who Can't Seem to Stop)

Description

This presentation will compare bad behaviors to addictive behaviors while defining sexual addiction. It will also examine multiple manifestations of addictive behaviors (i.e., on-line relationships, pornography, infidelity). The audience will learn treatment options for with sexual addiction and become familiar with resources.

Bio

Vicki Harris Wyatt, Ph.D., is the president and primary therapist for Wyatt Group Counseling. Dr. Wyatt holds a PhD in Family Relations from Oklahoma State University and is a Licensed Alcohol and Drug

Counselor (LADC) and a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC). She is also a Certified Alcohol, Drug, Substance Abuse Course (ADSAC) assessor. In addition to her drug and alcohol training and experience, Vicki Wyatt has extensive training and certifications as (1) a Certified Sex Addiction Therapist & Supervisor (CSAT-S) and a Certified Multiple Addictions Therapist (CMAT) by The International Institute for Trauma and Addiction Professionals (IITAP) under the direction of Dr. Patrick Carnes; a Hope & Freedom Practitioner ("CHFP") certified by Dr. Milton Magness for Three-day Intensive Recovery for individuals and couples on trauma and addiction; trained by EMDRIA for Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) therapy; and is a member of the American Association of Christian Counselors She is a candidate for the Association of Partners of Sex Addicts Trauma Specialists (APSATS).

Today Dr. Vicki Wyatt maintains a private practice in counseling in the private sector in Oklahoma City. Her practice focuses on individual and group therapy for drug and alcohol addictions, sexual addictions (compulsive sex, internet porn, sexual betrayal, etc.), family relations, ADD/ADHD treatment, "peak performance," and counseling in general. She is also certified in biofeedback, neurofeedback, and interactive metronome, which she uses in her counseling practice.

Historically, Dr. Wyatt has provided counseling in not-for-profit organizations and taught at regional and

comprehensive universities in Oklahoma. She has written and administered grants and served as an assistant professor of research at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, College of Public Health, where she was also a lead investigator on the HEART of OKC Teen Pregnancy Project and co-principal investigator for the High Risk HPV project, both funded through the Centers for Disease Control ("CDC"). Dr. Wyatt has also written and administered several grants through the United Way and Youth & Family Services. In 2002, Vicki Harris Wyatt was selected by the Journal Record News as one of fifty "Women Making a Difference" in the State of Oklahoma. Dr. Wyatt has presented at national conventions such as the National Council on Family Relations (NCFR) and the American Public Health Association (APHA) and has authored a variety of articles and book chapters published in various media.
